

What's covered? Quite a lot!

Many health plans cover the full cost of certain preventive care services. You may not have any cost sharing when you see a provider in your network.

For some services, coverage depends on your age and risk factors. Be sure to talk with your doctor about what's recommended for you. Your plan may pay for:

- Well-child visits and certain screenings
- Wellness checkups for adults
- Recommended vaccines*
- Abdominal aortic aneurysm screenings
- Birth control
- Breast cancer screenings
- Breastfeeding support and supplies
- Cervical cancer screenings
- Cholesterol screenings

- Colorectal cancer screenings
- Diabetes (type 2) screenings
- Hepatitis B and C screenings
- HIV screenings
- Lung cancer screenings
- Osteoporosis screenings
- Prenatal screenings
- Sexually transmitted infection screenings
- Smoking cessation support

This is not a complete list of the health care services you may need or that are available to you. Talk with your doctor about what may be right for you. Check your benefit plan to see what services may be covered. Certain preventive care services are provided as specified by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA), with no cost sharing to you. These services are based on your age, gender and other health factors. UnitedHealthcare also covers other routine services that may require a copay, coinsurance or deductible. You may share some of the costs for an office visit if preventive care was not the main reason for the visit.
